10.1 SPC-18-06-01 Source Protection Program Update

M. Keller noted that several of the presentations have been shortened in the interest of time.

M. Keller presented report SPC-18-06-01. R. Haggart asked if Lake Erie Region staff anticipate new wells coming online in the next year. M. Keller responded that the regulation changes require system owners to notify the Source Protection Authority (SPA) of their intent to expand or add a new system. Once source protection work is complete, the SPA will provide a notice to the system owner that the work is completed. Moving forward Lake Erie Region will likely

need to align source protection plan updates with specific municipalities as work on new or expanding drinking water systems is needed.

10.7 SPC-18-06-07 Re-Evaluating Issues in Mt. Pleasant, Bethel and St. George

E. Hayman presented report SPC-18-06-07. E. Hodgins asked if there are policies in the Grand River Source Protection Plan that directs a municipality to work with/engage farmers. M. Keller responded that report SPC-18-06-07 recommends that the County continue to monitor nitrate concentrations at the St. George wellfield. The County of Brant section of the source protection plan

includes policies that specifically speak to the reduction in fertilizer use through education and outreach, but it is not specific to the St. George wellfield. Lake Erie Region staff may follow-up with the County of Brant to determine if a wellfield-specific policy is warranted.

A. Dale has commented that there has been development in the business park near the Bethel wellfield over the past year, and asked if the development was dry industry; E. Hayman was aware of a stormwater management pond and an Adidas facility within the park. M. Keller felt it was a fair assumption to assume that the development it is dry industry.

11.1 Lake Erie Region Source Protection Committee request under Technical Rule 119, from February 3, 2011, Re: rehabilitation activities at an aggregate operation within a vulnerable area of a municipal drinking water system that allows ponding of water.

12. Other Business

- B. Ungar left the meeting at 3:08pm.
- M. Wales shared that the incoming provincial government has announced their intention to cut environmental programs and questioned if the source protection program may be at risk. M. Keller replied that Lake Erie Region's source protection funding is secure until the end of the fiscal year, March 2019, and has not received any indications from the province that cuts are imminent. R. Haggart asked if the chairs have been discussing this issue with the province. W. Wright-Cascaden responded that a chairs teleconference was held at the end of May 2018 - there will be a face-to-face meeting in October 2018. Chairs also have access to an online forum, however, to this point there have not been any posts/discussions regarding the financial future of the program. It is anticipated that the chairs will have an opportunity to speak with the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) during the October chairs and program managers meeting. The source protection program has been moved to the province's Policies and Programs Branch. The chairs felt that the move put the source protection program into a stronger more permanent position with. R. Haggart suggested that W. Wright-Cascaden initiate a discussion among the chairs regarding the financial future of the program.
- O. Yudina commented that the province acts as the caretaker of the source protection program. The Source Protection Programs Branch is waiting for direction from the new government.
- A. Dale added that the program was primarily funded by the province, now the source of funding is shifting to the municipalities. There may be a possibility that the program is downloaded to the municipalities.
- W. Wright-Cascaden will share the committee's concerns about downloading the program to the municipalities and the strength and future of the program with the chairs

in the next two weeks. M. Wales felt that W. Wright-Cascaden captured the committee's concerns and thought it would be good for the chairs to have a conversation with the Minister before the October chairs and program managers meeting. W. Wright-Cascaden will keep the committee up-to-date over the summer regarding any correspondence with the Minister.

E. Hodgins expressed concern about the recent regulation changes under the *Safe Drinking Water Act, 2002* and the *Clean Water Act, 2006*, specifically the increased responsibilities of the committee and potentially the increased number of committee meetings.

R. Haggart shared his resignation from the committee. W. Wright-Cascaden thanked R. Haggart on behalf of the committee.
